STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Expulsion from Academies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Sec. 1. Expulsion without hearing prohibited. No academy, or other corporation formed for educational purposes of a like grade, which receives aid from the state and to which is paid tuition by any town for the education of any of its pupils, shall expel any pupil therefrom until after due hearing upon charges, by the trustees, or a part thereof not less than 3, of such academy or corporation, before which said trustees, such accused pupil, shall have ample opportunity to appear and be heard in person, by his parents and by counsel in answer to such charges.

Sec. 2. Penalty. Whoever violates the provisions of this act shall be subject to a fine of \$100 for the 1st offense and of \$200 for the 2nd offense, which shall be paid into the state treasury and be allocated to the expenses of the department of education.
