STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Providing a Penalty for Causing Death by the Operation of Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 3 of chapter 129 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 3. Penalty for negligently killing or wounding human beings. Whoever while on a hunting trip, or in the pursuit of wild game or game birds, negligently or carelessly shoots and wounds, or kills any human being, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1000, or by imprisonment for not more than 10 years. Whoever operates any motor vehicle in a manner so as to endanger any person or property and thereby causes or hastens the death of any person shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1000 or by imprisonment for not more than 10 years.'
