AN ACT Relating to Hunting Licenses for Residents and Non-residents.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 39, § 41, amended. Sub-section 6 of section 41 of chapter 39 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'6. Any non-resident under the age of 16 years with the consent of his parent or guardian, may buy a junior non-resident hunting license to hunt wild birds, rabbits, raccoons, fox and unprotected wild birds and animals only, on the payment of \$2.15, and to hunt both wild birds and wild animals, on payment of \$5.15, of which 15 cents shall be retained by the agent issuing the license. Any resident under the age of 18 years may hunt without a license. ~~except that any resident under the age of 16 years must be accompanied by a parent or guardian at all times while in the fields or forests or on the waters or ice of the state with firearms in his possession.~~
