STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Relating to the Taking of Clam Worms.

Taking of clam, blood and sand worms, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue the following rule and regulation, that

(1) No person, firm or corporation shall take clam worms, blood worms and sand worms from within the tide waters of the state except under the following conditions:

(a) Unless the person shall have been a resident of the state for at least 5 years; and

(b) Unless such person shall have a license duly issued by the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries for which license no fee shall be charged.

(2) Whoever violates any provision of the foregoing provisions shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days.
