**RESOLVE, Relating to taking of Clams in South Thomaston.**

---

**Taking clams in South Thomaston, regulated. Resolved:** That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation forbidding any person not a resident or tax payer of the town of South Thomaston, in the county of Knox, to dig clams within the limits of said town. Any person taking clams contrary to the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or both such fine and imprisonment.
