RESOLVE, Relating to the Taking of Clams in Gouldsboro.

Taking of clams in Gouldsboro, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that it shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of or riparian owner in the town of Gouldsboro, in the county of Hancock, to dig clams within the limits of said town; except that non-residents may take not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of clams therefrom in any 1 day. Any person taking clams contrary to the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
