IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Impeachment of Witnesses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 96, § 118, amended. Section 118 of chapter 96 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 118. When testimony of a party may be contradicted by coplaintiffs or co-defendants. When one of the plaintiffs or defendants a party, either nominal or real, or the husband or wife of a party, is used as a witness by the opposite an adverse party, testimony may be introduced by his co-plaintiffs or co-defendants such adverse party to contradict or discredit him, as if he were not a party to the suit.'
