RESOLVE, in Favor of Mrs. Myrtie P. Webber, of Farmington Falls.

Mrs. Myrtie P. Webber; granted state bonus. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$100 to be paid to Mrs. Myrtie P. Webber, of Farmington Falls, the World War Bonus entitled her son, Kenneth Parker Webber, deceased; said sum to be paid from the general state funds.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Every honorably discharged veteran was voted a state bonus of \$100 if application was made by a certain date. Mrs. Webber did not know she was entitled to the money. Kenneth Parker Webber, born in Chesterville, Maine, 27 August 1896; lived at Vienna, Maine, in 1918; inducted into service at Waterville, Maine, July 25, 1918, sent to Camp Devens, Mass. and assigned to B. Co., 73rd. Infantry, 12th Division; died of Influenza Sept. 26, 1918.
