**AN ACT Exempting Trucking of Farm Products and Certain Lumbering
Products from the Common Carrier Law.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1935, c. 146, § 10, amended. The next to the last sentence of paragraph (A) of section 10 of chapter 146 of the public laws of 1935 is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following words:

‘; while engaged in the trucking of farm products and all wood, logs and lumber cut from the farm wood lots or forest area of this state; to a consumer or dealer; to a mill for manufacture or rail or boat for shipment; also horses, equipment and supplies to or from a logging operation to be used therein. Provided, however, that this amendment shall not apply to trucking or transportation where the distance exceeds the distance of 40 miles by the traveled way or route.’
