RESOLVE, Bonus Granted to John Charles Maher, of Old Town.

John Charles Maher granted state bonus. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, \$100 to be paid to John Charles Maher, of Old Town, as his World War bonus; said sum to be paid from the general state funds.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Every honorably discharged veteran was voted a state bonus of \$100 if application was made by a certain date. The reason for Mr. Maher's neglect is due to the fact that he is in the woods almost the entire year; fire warden for the state of Maine in the summer in the Patten district, and trapping in the winter.
