**RESOLVE, Relating to the Taking of Clams in Bar Harbor, and Lamoine.**

---

**Taking of clams in Bar Harbor, regulated. Resolved:** That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that it shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of or riparian owner in the town of Bar Harbor, in the county of Hancock, to dig clams for commercial purposes within the limits of said town. Any person taking clams contrary to the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, and be it further

**Resolved:** That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that it shall be unlawful for any person to dig clams for commercial purposes within and from the Jordan River Mussel Beds to the mouth of Berry's Cove, at Berry's Point and on the Marlboro side, beginning at Old Point, along the shore including mussel beds to the town line on the Skillings River, all in the town of Lamoine; provided, however, that any person may take not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  bushel of clams from said territory in any 1 day for home, or immediate consumption. Any person taking clams contrary to the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
