STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Approach to Musquash Bridge.

Approach to Musquash bridge; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$22,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1940, to construct 1000 feet of approach to Musquash bridge in Grand Lake Stream Plantation. Any unexpended balance at the end of the fiscal year shall be available for construction of the same on any succeeding fiscal year. Funds shall be taken for this purpose from the general highway fund, and shall be expended under the supervision of the highway commission.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

A new Musquash bridge with 600 feet of approach is now under construction. However, the problem of proper access to Grand Lake Stream still remains for the reason that the Musquash area in the vicinity of the bridge is a wide extent of bog land and there will still remain 1000 feet of needed approach to be built over this bog at an estimated figure of \$22,000. The present approach is a dangerously narrow, low, corduroyed roadway, subject to flooding, erosion and settlement.

Thousands of persons, attracted by excellent fishing and hunting facilities, annually visit here and are, of course, favorably or unfavorably impressed by the comfort and safety of the roads they must traverse.
