AN ACT Relating to Lien on Lands for Drilling Wells.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Lien on lands. Whoever performs labor or furnishes labor or materials in the drilling of a well for a water supply on any land, by virtue of a contract with or by consent of the owner thereof, has a lien on the lot of land, or farm, on which said well is drilled, to secure payment therefor with costs. Such lien may be preserved and enforced in the same manner and under the same restrictions as liens for buildings and lots are preserved and enforced under sections 29 to 43, inclusive, of chapter 105 of the revised statutes, and is made subject to all the provisions of said sections wherever applicable.
