IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Barber Shops.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. L., 1937, c. 190, additional. Chapter 190 of the public laws of 1937 is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be number 20-A, and to read as follows:

'Sec. 20-A. Barbering on Sunday prohibited. No person shall practice barbering on Sunday unless the city or town wherein the act is performed shall have passed an ordinance so to do.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 5, § 136, amended. Section 136 of chapter 5 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new paragraph to be numbered III-A, and to read as follows:

'III-A. Respecting the practice of barbering on Sunday.'
