IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relative to Game Preserve in York County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 90, amended. Section 90 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto, after the second paragraph thereof, the following:

‘Old Orchard Beach; no person shall, except as herein provided, at any time, hunt, pursue, shoot at, molest or kill any wild animal or wild bird, within the following described territory situated in the town of Old Orchard Beach; beginning at the point on the westerly town line of Old Orchard Beach where the Boston and Maine railroad crosses Goose Fare brook, thence easterly along said Boston and Maine railroad right of way to Tunis avenue, thence southeasterly along Tunis avenue to the Atlantic ocean, thence westerly and southerly by the Atlantic ocean to Goose Fare brook, thence by Goose Fare brook westerly to the point of beginning.

The provisions of this act shall not prohibit the commissioner of inland fisheries and game from regulating the taking of fur-bearing animals on Goose Fare marsh, so-called.’
