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**AN ACT Relating to the Use of the State Seal.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 127, additional.** Chapter 127 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 7-A, and to read as follows:

**'Sec. 7-A. Use of state seal; penalty.** No imitation imprint, representation, facsimile or copy of the seal of the state of Maine shall be used or displayed by any person, firm, or corporation, except by an officer or a department of the state of Maine, and their representatives duly qualified, or by written permission of the governor. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$300, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days.'
