S T A T E O F M A I N E

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Agricultural Societies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 39, § 35, amended. Section 35 of chapter 39 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows :

'Sec. 35. Sale of merchandise and refreshments, and exhibitions, near grounds restricted. Whoever sells any refreshments, or other merchandise, or exhibits any show or play, within $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile of the fair grounds of any agricultural society, during the time of any exhibition thereof, unless in his own dwelling-house, or usual and ordinary place of business or lets any land or building adjoining, or overlooking the fair grounds of such society, to spectators of any exhibition thereof, **or for parking of cars**, during the time of such exhibition, without the written consent of its trustees, forfeits to such society not exceeding \$100, to be recovered on complaint of 2 of its trustees.'
