RESOLVE, Relating to Fishing in Kenduskeag Stream.

Fishing in Kenduskeag stream, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, be and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Kenduskeag stream in the city of Bangor, and in the towns of Glenburn and Kenduskeag, from Bulls-eye bridge, so-called, in the city of Bangor to Worthen's Mill Dam, so-called, in the town of Kenduskeag, and all tributaries flowing directly or indirectly into said portion of Kenduskeag stream, to all fishing to May 1st, 1941, after which time there shall be an open season from May 1st to July 1st of each year; establishing a daily bag limit of 10 fish or 5 pounds in any one day.
