STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Relating to Digging of Clams in Harrington.

Taking clams in Harrington, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioners of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to repeal rule and regulation numbered 52 as set forth in the official rules and regulations of the department, and chapter 14 of the resolves of 1937, and to issue the following rule and regulation in place thereof:

'Any person not a resident of the town of Harrington, in the county of Washington, is forbidden to dig more than $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of clams within I day within the limits of said town. Any person taking clams contrary to the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
