STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Recording of Personal Property Titles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Recording personal property titles, regulated. Any instrument, entitled by law to be recorded, which by its terms transfers or retains title to personal property as security for the payment of money or the performance of any obligation, may be discharged by an entry made on the margin of the record of said instrument, acknowledging satisfaction thereof or by a proper written instrument, signed by the person to whom the money is payable or the obligation is due or by his executor, administrator or assignee. If such person or his executor, administrator or assignee, after full payment of the money or performance of the obligation aforesaid, whether before or after breach refuses or neglects for 7 days after thereto requested to make such discharge, he shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$50, to be recovered in an action on the case.
