S T A T E O F M A I N E

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Digging of Clams in the Town of Brooklin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Inhabitants only may dig clams for commercial purposes. No person, not an inhabitant of said town of Brooklin, shall dig clams for commercial purposes within said town.

Sec. 2. Penalties. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act, for each offense, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days.
