STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Digging of Clams in the Town of Sedgwick.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. Inhabitants only may dig clams for commercial purposes. No person, not an inhabitant of said town of Sedgwick, shall dig clams for commercial purposes within said town.
- Sec. 2. Penalties. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act, for each offense, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days.
