IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relative to Game Preserve in Lily Bay, county of Piscataquis.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 38, § 90, amended. Section 90 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto, after the second paragraph thereof, the following :

‘Lily Bay ; no person shall, except as herein provided, at any time, hunt, pursue, shoot at, molest or kill any wild animal or wild bird, within the following described territory situated in the town of Lily Bay in Piscataquis county : beginning at Stevens Point, so-called, which is the point of land forming the southern extremity of “The Narrows”, thence following the shore of Moosehead lake in a southerly and easterly direction to the point where North Logan brook, so-called, enters Moosehead lake, thence northerly up North Logan brook to the point where this brook crosses the tote road leading from Lily Bay to “The Narrows,” thence northwesterly along this tote-road to Stevens Point at the point of beginning.

This preserve shall also include such islands as lie in Doughnut Cove in Moosehead lake. The entire tract contains 2,176 acres, more or less.’
