STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Knox Academy of Arts and Sciences, Inc.,
Under the Educational Laws of Maine.

Whereas, since this academy functions as a special state institution for scientific research, and the wider dissemination amongst the people of knowledge of the advancement of science and art and the value—educational and material—to the state of such knowledge; and since the academy is maintaining an arboretum for the introduction and trial for adaptability to our soil and climate of foreign trees and shrubs; and since its hundred acres of land is also a sanctuary for wild life—of animal, birds and flowers—; and since it is to conduct a summer school for nature students and teachers; now therefore, be it

Knox Academy recognized as state-aid institution. Resolved: By this legislature that the Knox Academy be, and hereby is, to be from now on recognized as a state-aid institution, entitled to and to receive an annual appropriation for maintenance; and be it further

Resolved: That the sum of \$10,000, \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1940, and \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1941, be and hereby is appropriated from the state treasury and paid over to the directors (or trustees) of the said academy, to be used for operating and current expenses.
