**AN ACT Amending the Unemployment Compensation Law to Increase
Certain Penalties.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1935, c. 192, § 16, amended. Sub-section (a) of section 16 of chapter 192 of the public laws of 1935 is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘(a) Whoever makes a false statement or representation knowing it to be false or knowingly fails to disclose a material fact, to obtain or increase any benefit or other payment under this act, either for himself or for any other person, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$20 nor more than \$50, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment **or by the suspension of the right to receive unemployment benefits for a period of 1 year, or by both such fine and imprisonment and suspension:** and each such false statement or representation or failure to disclose a material fact shall constitute a separate offense.’
