AN ACT Relating to Surface Treatment of Third Class Highways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Sec. 1. Provision for surface treatment of third class highways. The highway commission each year shall set aside from the general highway fund, as defined in section 1 of chapter 251 of the public laws of 1933, as amended, for the construction of third class highways as defined by section 5 of chapter 28 of the revised statutes in each town a sufficient amount to provide for the application of bituminous or other suitable surface treatment to each section constructed from said fund, provided, however, that the provisions of this section shall not be applicable to any third class highways which, in the judgment of the commission, do not require such surface treatment.

Sec. 2. Provision for treating third class highways. The highway commission, upon request of the municipal officers of any town, may set aside from funds available for the construction of third class highways in that town any amounts in excess of those contemplated by the last preceding section for the purpose of the application of bituminous or other suitable surface treatment to third class highways.
