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**AN ACT** Relating to the Printing of Ballots.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 8, § 2, amended.** The last sentence in section 2 of chapter 8 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Except as otherwise herein provided, ballots for use in elections of senators and representatives to the Congress of the United States, state and county officers, and senators and representatives to the state legislature shall be printed upon clean white paper and ballots to be used in elections as to constitutional and referendum questions submitted to the vote of the people shall be printed upon tinted paper, the color or tint of which to be determined by the secretary of state, without any distinguishing mark or figure thereon.'
