IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

RESOLVE, for Screening Mattawamkeag Lake, in Island Falls.

Mattawamkeag lake; screening of. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$5,000 to be taken from the appropriation for the maintenance of the department of inland fisheries and game, to aid in the screening of Mattawamkeag lake, located in the town of Island Falls, in the county of Aroostook; provided, however, that said appropriation shall not be available until some responsible person, corporation, or incorporated fish and game club, or the town in which the outlet of the lake above mentioned is situated, or some other town in the county of Aroostook, in which said waters are situated, shall have agreed to assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of the water through the same.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This is the final lake in the chain of lakes known as Pleasant Lake, Mud Lake, Rockabema Lake. It has a great depth of water throughout the center portion of the lake suitable for salmon fishing. It is felt by fish and game clubs and others in Aroostook county that if a screen were built at the base of this lake and the lake stocked with salmon, it would become an ideal rendezvous for sportsmen in a very few years.
