STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

RESOLVE, for Screening Outlet of Moosehead Lake at Indian Pond.

Moosehead Lake at Indian Pond; screening of. Resolved: That the sum of \$20,000 be, and hereby is, appropriated, to be taken from the general funds of the state, to be expended by the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, to screen the outlet of Moosehead Lake at Indian Pond; provided, however, that no appropriation hereafter specified for the erection of a screen at the outlet of said lake shall be available until some responsible corporation, or incorporated fish and game club, or the town in which the outlet of the lake to be screened is situated, or some other town in the county in which said waters are situated, shall have in legal town meeting, and having an article in the warrant for said town meeting for that purpose, by vote of record, vote to assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of water through the same.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The fishing in Moosehead Lake constitutes one of the greatest recreational features of the state, and the people interested therein feel that this body of water suffers a great loss of fish annually through lack of a screen at its outlet.
