IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Marking Certain Highways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Painting a white line on certain highways. The state highway commission, at the expense of the state, shall cause to be painted near the middle of all state highways, state aid highways, and third class roads where the surface thereof is black as the result of treatment thereof, a broken white line and at all places thereon where it is illegal to overtake and pass another vehicle proceeding in the same direction, a solid white line.
