AN ACT to Repeal the Organization of the Plantation of Dallas.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Dallas Plantation organization repealed; corporate existence survives for certain purposes. The organization of the plantation of Dallas, pursuant to authority thereto conferred by chapter 123 of the private and special laws of 1895, is hereby repealed; provided, however, that the corporate existence, powers, duties, and liabilities of said plantation shall survive for the purpose of prosecuting and defending all pending suits and causes of suits to which said plantation is or may be a party, and all needful processes growing out of the same, and for the further purpose of providing for the payment of all debts and any judgments which may be rendered against said plantation and to pay state and county taxes for the year 1939.

Sec. 2. School fund and unexpended funds. The school fund deposited to the credit of said plantation, and all funds unexpended for school purposes at the time when this act is effective out of amounts raised by said plantation for school purposes or out of amounts paid by the state for school purposes, shall be paid by the treasurer of said plantation or such

other person in whose custody such funds may be, to the treasurer of state. Such amounts, so received, shall be added to the unorganized township funds as provided in section 23 of chapter 11 of the revised statutes.

Sec. 3. Effective date. This act is subject to the provisions of chapter 73 of the public laws of 1937 and shall become effective March 31, 1940.
