**RESOLVE, To Reimburse Certain Exhibitors at the Penobscot and  
Piscataquis Fair.**

---

**Certain exhibitors; reimbursed. Resolved:** That there be paid to certain exhibitors at the Penobscot and Piscataquis Fair of 1938, the state's portion of premiums allowed to them by said Penobscot and Piscataquis Society and not paid because of the financial condition of said Society.

Such portion to be determined in the case of each of the several exhibitors at said fair by applying the regular stipend percentage for that year to the total amount awarded such exhibitors by the said society.

To be distributed by the commissioner of agriculture according to a certified list of awards submitted by officers of the society.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

Exhibitors at the 1938 Penobscot and Piscataquis Fair made their displays of agricultural products and live stock in good faith and were awarded premiums in the amount of (approximately \$700.00). These premiums were well earned and deserved but the Society has had an unusual run of hard luck and it has been unable to pay them.

Under these conditions the Society itself is not entitled to its share of the State's Stipend but this State money is available and it is the purpose of this Resolve to provide for its payment directly to the exhibitors as has been done in certain other similar cases of record.
