IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT to Incorporate the First Universalist Society of Gardiner, Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Incorporation; powers. Norman H. Trafton, Lincoln Harlow, Richard H. Laselle, Andrew M. Lund, Elbert D. Hayford, and other members of the Universalist Society of Gardiner, Maine, are hereby incorporated into a parish and as such are invested with all the powers and privileges conferred by the general laws of the state relating to parishes.

Sec. 2. Parish may hold property. Said parish may hold property to the amount of \$25,000.
