RESOLVE, Relating to Close Time on Lobsters in Certain Waters.

Close time on lobsters in certain waters, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to repeal rule and regulation numbered 79, (formerly P. & S. L., 1925, c. 19 and R. & R. 7) as published in the official rules and regulations of the department and to issue the following rule and regulation:

‘No person or persons shall set any trap or other device used for catching lobsters between the 1st day of July and 9 A. M., August 31st of each year, under a penalty of \$5 for each trap or other device set within the following described limits: Commencing at Township Rock in said town of Cutler, thence running south southwest $2\frac{3}{4}$ miles; thence south southeast $\frac{1}{2}$ mile; thence south by west $\frac{3}{4}$ west, to the 3 mile limit; thence running along said 3 mile limit to the International Boundary line with Canada, thence along said International Boundary line to a line drawn from the breakwater at Lubec in a general easterly direction to Mullholand’s Point on the Island of Campobello, New Brunswick.’
