STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Regulating Digging of Clams Within the Limits of the Towns of South Bristol and Boothbay.

Digging of clams; regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that it shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of the towns of So. Bristol and Boothbay, in the county of Lincoln, to dig for clams within the limits of said towns, provided, however, that this regulation shall not apply to the digging of clams on the flats or along the shore of the Sheepscot river, so-called, within the town of Boothbay. This shall not interfere with any law relating to taking shellfish for bait for fishermen.

Whoever violates the provisions hereof shall for each offense be punished by a fine of not more than \$10, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days.
