RESOLVE, Relating to Taking of Clams in Machiasport.

Taking clams in Machiasport; regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to repeal rule and regulation numbered 46, which relates to taking of clams in Machiasport, as it appears in the official rules and regulations of the department, which was authorized by section 3 of chapter 2 of the public laws of 1933, and to insert in place thereof the following:

‘It shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of the town of Machiasport, in the county of Washington, to dig clams for commercial purposes within the limits of said town.

Persons not residents of the town of Machiasport may be permitted to dig for clams for fish bait or home consumption within the limits of said town; provided, however, that no person shall dig for purposes mentioned herein during any one day more than 1 bushel of clams.

Whoever violates the provisions hereof shall for each offense be punished by a fine not exceeding \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days.’
