**AN ACT Relating to Operation of Motor Boats on Long Lake and  
Brandy Pond.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

**Sec. 1. Regulations.** The operator of every motor boat driven or navigated on the waters of Long Lake and Brandy Pond in Cumberland county shall not :

(a) Drive or navigate such motor boat at a speed exceeding 10 miles an hour when at a distance of 300 feet or less from shore.

(b) Drive or navigate such motor boat at a speed exceeding 10 miles an hour between sunset and sunrise or in a fog or thick weather.

(c) Drive or navigate a motor boat, when approaching any canoe or rowboat, at a speed exceeding 8 miles an hour when within a distance of 100 feet from such canoe or rowboat.

**Sec. 2. Exceptions.** The provisions of this act shall not apply to any motor boat while actually competing in a race held under the auspices of a racing association.

**Sec. 3. Penalty.** Whoever violates the provisions of this act shall be subject to a fine not exceeding \$50 or imprisonment not exceeding 30 days.
