AN ACT Relating to the Sale of Malt Beverages in Bay Point Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Local option. At the biennial election commencing with the year 1940, the legal voters of Bay Point Village Corporation, within the town of Georgetown, are authorized to give in their votes upon the following question: "Shall licenses be granted in Bay Point Village Corporation for the sale therein of malt liquor?"

Sec. 2. Ballots. The secretary of state shall prepare and furnish to said town for use in said Bay Point Village Corporation, ballots in manner and form prescribed by section 17 of chapter 300 of the public laws of 1933, as amended, with any change necessary to conform to the provisions of this act; all other provisions of said chapter, except as may be modified by the requirements hereof shall apply to said corporation.

Sec. 3. Other votes in Georgetown. For such biennial election the secretary of state, in the preparation of ballots for voting under said section 17, shall draft them in such form to include all the legal voters of said town of Georgetown, except the voters of said Bay Point Village Corporation.
