IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to the Appointment and Tenure of Trial Justices.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 97, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 97 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘Sec. 1. Trial justices, appointment and tenure. Trial justices shall be appointed and commissioned by the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, to act within the county for which they are appointed, and shall hold their offices for 7 years from the date of their commissions. **This section shall not apply to Cumberland county, in which the office of trial justice is hereby abolished.’**
