## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Permits for Non-Resident Charter Parties.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The 4th paragraph of section 41 of chapter 29 of the revised statutes as amended by chapter 233 of the public laws of 1933 and chapter 54 of the public laws of 1937 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Third. Any passenger bus bringing into the state persons as a single an organized group or party for whose exclusive use such bus has been chartered and is so used and which is chartered and intended to be used solely for use as a continuous means of conveyance for such group of persons while they are touring traveling in the state and for no other purpose, provided a permit for such operation be issued by the secretary of state. The operator of each such bus shall obtain from the secretary of state, or some of his agents or inspectors a permit describing and identifying the vehicle. Said permit shall state the date of issuance, and thereon shall be printed a copy of this paragraph. No such permit shall be issued until the operator files with the secretary of state proof of insurance as provided for by section 54-A, and a copy of the charter agreement as required in this paragraph. Upon filing proof of insurance in accordance with the provisions of section 54-A together with an application signed by the owner or operator of such bus and by the party or a repre-

sentative of the group chartering such bus and stating the period of time for which such permit is desired, a description of the bus, the name of the chauffeur who is to operate the same, a description of the contemplated trip and other information as may be required by the secretary of state, a permit for such operation may be issued.'
