RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in South Pond.

Fishing in South pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing a daily bag limit of 10 fish, not less than 8 inches in length, per person per day, taken from the waters of South pond in Sandy River plantation, in the county of Franklin.
