STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Amending the Law Against Burning Property of Another.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. I. R. S., c. 130, § 4, amended. Section 4 of chapter 130 of the revised statutes as amended is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 4. Burning of produce, trees, etc.; penalty. Whoever wilfully and maliciously burns any corn, grain, hay, vegetables, or other produce, or any soil, trees, underwood, or other personal property of whatever nature or description of his wife or of another, shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than I year, nor more than 3 years.'
