STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT to Permit Town and City Officers to Limit the Number of Liquor Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Town and city officers may limit number of licenses. The municipal officers of a town or city may establish the number of licenses which may be issued for the sale of intoxicating liquors in any town or city where by a majority vote the sale of liquor is permitted, and the state liquor commission shall not issue any licenses for the sale of such liquors in excess of the number established by the officers of the said town or city.
