AN ACT Relating to the Proper Branding of Potatoes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1935, c. 51, § 4, amended. Section 4 of chapter 51 of the public laws of 1935 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 4. Sale without grading by grower permitted. No provision of this act shall be construed to prevent a grower of potatoes ~~within this state~~ from selling or delivering the same within the state unpacked or unmarked, or selling his crop in bulk, or any part thereof, to a packer for grading, packing or storage within the state. Nor shall any provision of this act prevent ~~a grower or packer~~ **any person** from manufacturing the same into any by-products, or from selling the same unpacked or unmarked to any person actually engaged in the operation of a commercial by-products factory for the sole and express purpose of being used within the state in the manufacture of a by-product for resale.'
