RESOLVE, Making an Appropriation for the Purchase of Land Adjoining Land of the State Military Department, at Augusta, Known as Camp Keyes.

Purchase of certain property, authorized. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$12,000 for the purchase of 2 parcels of land adjoining land in Augusta, used by the military department of the state for the purpose of enlarging said grounds now used for military and aviation purposes, being those designated in an agreement which is hereby authorized and validated between the adjutant general and William H. Gannett of Augusta; said sum to be paid from the general funds of the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This resolve contemplates the purchase of two lots of land owned by William H. Gannett of Augusta, Maine, for the sum of \$12,000 to increase the facilities for building upon and extending the grounds now used for military and aviation purposes.

The first parcel is located on the northerly side of Western Avenue, in said Augusta, and is bounded on the east and north by land of the state of Maine; on the west by land of _____; on the south by the northerly line of said Western Avenue, and extending along said Western Avenue approximately 900 feet with a depth of 150 feet.

The second parcel is located on the westerly side of Blaine Avenue and is bounded on the north and west by land of the state of Maine; on the south by land of the said William H. Gannett, and on the east by the westerly line of said Blaine Avenue, extending along said Blaine Avenue 180 feet with a depth of 161.2 feet.
