STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Resignation of Attorneys-at-Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Provision for resignation of attorneys. Any member of the bar of the state of Maine may resign from the office of attorney and counsellor at law by submitting his resignation to any justice of the supreme judicial court who may or may not, in his discretion, in the name of the state of Maine accept such resignation and order that such attorney's name be stricken from the roll of attorneys of the state. No person whose resignation from his office of attorney and counsellor of law has been accepted by a justice of the supreme judicial court, as aforesaid, shall be reinstated as an attorney and counsellor at law or readmitted to the practice of law in any of the courts of the state of Maine.
