IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Veterans Preference

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Veterans granted a preference in civil service examinations. Honorably discharged soldiers, sailors and marines, who served in the United States Armed Forces during the World War (on and after April 6, 1917 and before November 12, 1918), shall have 5 points added to their earned ratings, and war veterans who establish by official records the present existence of a service-connected disability, shall have 10 points added to their earned rating, in all examinations held under the supervision of the state personnel board, as created by chapter 221 of the public laws of 1937.
