AN ACT Relating to Trapping of Bear.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 72, amended. Paragraph (c) of section 72 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘(c) The black bear is hereby classified as a game animal. It shall be lawful to hunt and trap bear at any time, anywhere, in the state, from ~~October~~ **September** 1st to November 30th, both days inclusive, and it shall also be lawful for any farmer or owner of live stock to kill bear at any time while they are on his own property; except that bear may be legally taken, in any town, plantation or unincorporated place where a bounty has been, or may be declared under the provisions of section 79.’
