STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relative to Fishing for Gain or Hire.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 27, amended. Section 27 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 27. Fishing for gain or hire prohibited; exceptions; penalty. Whoever shall, for the whole or any part of the time, engage in the business or occupation of fishing on any of the inland waters of the state above tide-waters, for salmon, togue, trout, black bass, pickerel, white perch or white fish for gain or hire, shall for every such offense pay a fine of \$50 and costs, except that pickerel legally taken in the county of Washington, may be sold by the person taking the same.'
