IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relative to "Trolling."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 18, amended. Section 18 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

“Trolling” is hereby designated as a method of fishing whereby the bait or lure is drawn through the water behind a boat, continually in motion, propelled by motive power other than wind or current, and it shall be unlawful to use more than 2 spoons, so-called, on any one line.’
